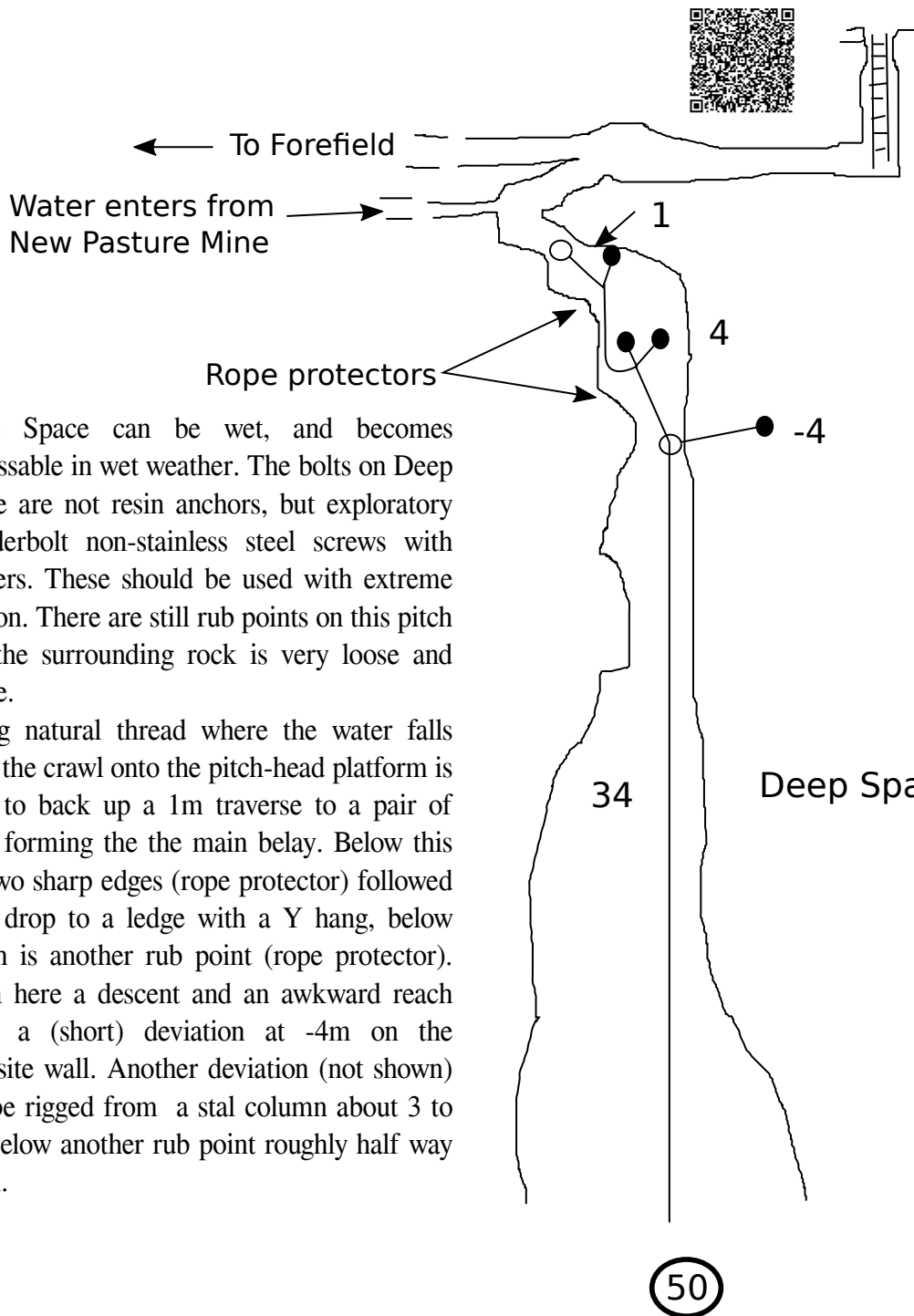


Hungerhill Swallet Stoney Middleton

50m rope, 4 maillons, 2 deviation slings (1 short) + 2 krabs, 2 rope protectors.



Entrance shaft with ladder.
Lid needs a Derbyshire key

Deep Space can be wet, and becomes impassable in wet weather. The bolts on Deep Space are not resin anchors, but exploratory thunderbolt non-stainless steel screws with hangers. These should be used with extreme caution. There are still rub points on this pitch and the surrounding rock is very loose and brittle.

A big natural thread where the water falls from the crawl onto the pitch-head platform is used to back up a 1m traverse to a pair of bolts forming the the main belay. Below this are two sharp edges (rope protector) followed by a drop to a ledge with a Y hang, below which is another rub point (rope protector). From here a descent and an awkward reach gains a (short) deviation at -4m on the opposite wall. Another deviation (not shown) can be rigged from a stal column about 3 to 4m below another rub point roughly half way down.
